PURPOSE OF THE POSITION:

The JRBA Office Manager will be the primary contact for the 18 churches of the Association for information and submitting reports. He/she will work closely with the Officers, Committee Chairs, and Executive Board. Responsibilities include the publication of a monthly newsletter, sending out Annual Church Profiles, preparing agendas for the Executive Board meetings, making arrangements for various functions, submitting reports to the state and national affiliates, preparing programs for the Annual and Semi-Annual meetings, and preparing a JRBA Directory and Annual Book of Reports.

RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

- 1. Manage the daily operations of the office including organizing mail, answering phone calls, completing Benevolence applications and meeting with Benevolence clients (as needed), corresponding with churches and state affiliates via email/phone calls, and interacting with the public.
- 2. Collect information from the churches in order to complete the monthly calendar and newsletter. The calendar and newsletter should be posted to the association website and an email notice go to all email recipients. Hard copies should be printed and mailed to the churches.
- 3. Once Annual Church Profiles are available from SBC or BGAV, they are to be printed and sent to the Clerks of each JRBA Church, along with instructions.
- 4. Coordinating with the Moderator in order to prepare/print Executive Board Agendas prior to the quarterly meetings. (January, April, July, and October)
- 5. Coordinating with the Program Chair and Moderator to prepare/print the Programs for the Semi-Annual Meeting (May) and Annual Meeting (October).
- 6. Preparation, printing, binding, and distribution of an Annual JRBA Directory and Book of Reports.
- 7. Maintain association website.

Again, we say thank you for all you do for Hope! We are blessed in the JRBA to now have folks that can serve on two teams! Team Woody from here and Team Nawrocki from Culpepper were able to serve two sets of schools because of the folks from Antioch Scottsville and Mt. Zion.

Our trip was dampened because Wayne and Linda Gough were in an accident and were not able to go. However, they still worked behind the scenes in many ways to hep our efforts. Once there, Roger Woody came down with a virus and had to go back home. He and Darlene were also missed as we went into our schools. We were enhanced by the other folks from Spring Hill and Howerton Baptist Churches.

JRBA SEMI-ANNUAL SPRING MEETING

The 190th Semi-Annual Spring Meeting of the James River Baptist Association met at Tar Wallet Baptist Church on Thursday, May 9, 2024. Forty messengers and four visitors were officially in attendance. Eight of the messengers were JRBA Pastors. There were several additional folks from Tar Wallet who assisted with the fellowship meal. The Junior Troupe (14 students) and their leaders (2), along with many parents, grandparents, and friends came for dinner and attended the worship service as well. It was good to see such a full house for worship, with so many young families represented!



Registration began at 5:45 PM. The meeting was opened at 6:00 PM by Rev. Alan Gough welcoming everyone and talking about the theme: *Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not turn from it.* Proverbs 22:6. Alan related this verse to his childhood. Mrs. Marilyn Snoddy announced the upcoming retirement of Phyllis Tyler and recognized her for her almost-19 years of service as the JRBA Secretary. She graciously expressed her appreciation, as well as that of the association. She then presented Phyllis with a Retirement Bonus, a beautiful "Grandma" plaque, a card with scripture notes, and a beautifully decorated cake. Phyllis thanked everyone for their support and expressed her love for everyone in JRBA. Rev. Alan Gough gave instructions for the fellowship meal and gave the blessing. Then everyone proceeded to the fellowship hall where they enjoyed a delicious meal, AND cake!

After a wonderful time of fellowship around the table, everyone made their way back to the sanctuary for the Business Session and Worship. The



session began with a prelude by Barbara Bersch, Pianist. The Invocation was given by Rev. Robert Silby, Goshen. Marilyn then called the business session to order and presented the updated program for approval. It was approved and Gwynn Tyler had the roll call of churches.

Gwynn then presented the Personnel Committee Report. The JRBA Executive Board approved Phyllis Tyler's resignation, effective June 15, 2024, at their April quarterly Executive Board Meeting. Based on the guidelines of the JRBA ByLaws, Moderator Marilyn Snoddy appointed an Ad Hoc Personnel Committee, charged with the responsibility of finding a new secretary for the Association. Committee members are Marilyn Snoddy, Audrey Ragland, Judy Ownby, Rev. Austin Williams, and Gwynn Tyler, Chair. The committee has met three times and developed a job description and are working on a Policy Manual. Phyllis is preparing an Office Manual outlining all the duties, responsibilities, contact information, and office procedures. The position will now be called Office Manager since it entails more responsibility than being just a secretary. (See page 1 of the newsletter for the job description, qualifications, etc.) The committee planned to announce the position soon after the spring meeting on both the JRBA and BGAV web sites. (This has been done.) The following recommendations were made by the committee and approved:

- 1. The position of JRBA Office Manager will be a part-time position with a pay per hourly rate of \$14.00 for 16 hours per week. For budgeting purposes, this rate, along with our part of Social Security, will come to an annual compensation of a little over \$12,500.00 for the budget year. (This is very close to the already approved compensation for 2023 -2024.) The Personnel Committee and the Office Manger will set the office hours based on the person's preferred schedule with the office continuing to be open at least two days per week. There may be a few exceptions based on holidays or extra work that may need to be done.
- 2. The Personnel Committee will be authorized to interview applicants, select someone, and hire him/her.
- 3. The Personnel Committee will be authorized to change the hourly rate as deemed necessary for a new hire.
- 4. The Personnel Committee will also determine a plan of operations during the transitional period until an Office Manager is secured.
- 5. The Personnel Committee will become a JRBA Standing Committee for the purpose of overseeing and evaluating the performance of the Office Manager and any future employees.
- 6. The Personnel Committee will be authorized to create a Personnel Policy Manual.

The recommendations of the Personnel Committee were unanimously approved.

Rita Harris, Nominating Committee Chair, then presented the updated Slate of Officers for 2024 – 2025. Since the slate of officers was approved at the April Executive Board Meeting, Rev. Austin Williams has agreed to stay on as Treasurer and Robert Spiers has agreed to serve as the Disaster Relief Coordinator. Rita noted that the positions of Vice Moderator, Baptist Men's Director, and VBS Leader remain vacant. If anyone is willing to take on any of these roles, please let her know. A new parliamentarian will also need to be appointed in October. The Slate of Officers was approved as presented.

Donielle Yoder, Southside Pregnancy Center, was slated to talk to JRBA about the upcoming Walks for Life and how you can support their work, but she was unable to attend. Rev. Skip Wallace, BGAV Field Strategist for Central/Valley Region, brought greetings from BGAV. He noted the 200th celebration of BGAV life back in November, 2023, and noted that the Baptist General Association of Virginia (BGAV) is a "missionary movement unleashing the power of the resurrected Christ through the local church for the renewal of all things". He made available brochures for anyone with questions. He thanked JRBA for partnering with BGAV. He noted some currently spouted "rumors" that BGAV supports homosexual marriage and some hospitals that perform abortions. These rumors are NOT true. BGAV works to build and expand the Redeemer's Kingdom and reach the lost for Jesus Christ!
