

WMUV Offers Mission Grants to Local Churches

JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting April 8, 2024

Marilyn Snoddy, Moderator, opened the JRBA Quarterly Executive Board Meeting with a devotional on Acts 16:9: During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." God will put a burden on your heart when he wants you to do something! This request of Paul is called the Macedonian call - the man was reaching out to Paul to come to Macedonia and God wanted him to preach the Gospel to the Macedonians. As we get ready for our Youth Explosion, we need to realize that the young people are reaching out for something. We need to make sure they learn that Jesus is what they need in their lives! Please encourage the youth in your church to come out - those who already know the Gospel and have accepted Jesus need to be there for those who will learn and accept Him in their hearts. They need to come alongside them and encourage them in their new faith. We aren't just supposed to invite others to church, but rather show them the way to salvation and then disciple them. Marilyn then led us in singing Send the Light. Sheree Silby played the piano.

Marilyn then called the meeting to order and Gwynn Tyler had the Roll Call of Churches. There were 25 in attendance, representing 12 churches. The Minutes of the January 8, 2024, Quarterly Executive Board Meeting were presented and approved. The Treasurer's Quarterly Report and the Budget vs. Actual Report were presented by Rev. Austin Williams, Treasurer, and approved. As of March 31, 2024, the Checking Account Balance stood at \$34,364.71 with outstanding deposits of \$1,260.00. This total includes Additional Missions Fund -\$100; Mission Trips - \$1,150; Rise Against Hunger - \$932.70; Mission Blitz - \$648.52; Christian Education/Training/Evangelism - \$35 and Baccalaureates - \$450. Receipts for the past quarter totaled \$15,617.84. This includes donations from JRBA churches of \$8,906.68; Designated Gifts of \$300.00; Interest on Checking - \$3.46; Youth Revival - \$4,200.00, Rise Against Hunger - \$707.70; Individuals - \$400.00; and Bland - \$1,100. Total Disbursements: \$9,945.37 which includes \$700 for Mission Trips, \$300 Additional Missions (designated funds), and \$265 - Education (3 pastors to Preach 2024 Conference, Youth Rally at Antioch-Scottsville, and 1 Treasurer to attend the Tax Seminar). The CD Account Balance is \$10,406.14. Per the Budget vs. Actual Report, of the Total Budget (\$28,618.52), actual expenditures for quarters 1 - 2 totaled \$8,545.37, with \$20,505.85 remaining. Austin noted that the \$300 designated donation was for Piedmont Habitat for Humanity, BGAV Disaster Relief, and Gideons International which had been removed from the regular budget. He also noted that JRBA had secured a grant of \$2,000 from the BGAV Kairos Initiative for Student Evangelism for our Youth Revival. Austin also presented a report for the Knights' Pantry ministry. The checking account balance stands at \$2,698.33 (Outstanding Deposit of \$281). He said that about 15 students are utilizing the pantry each week and a few others occasionally pick up items as well. Disbursements for the quarter totaled \$124.21 for the purchase of paper bags. He thanked the churches for their contributions, both monetary and goods. The Knights' Pantry Report was approved as presented.

Next, Mrs. Betty Toney, Chair, presented the Quarterly Report for the John E. Mann Sr. Benevolence Emergency Fund. From January 1 – March 31, 2024, this fund was able to assist one individual with Food Lion gift Cards after a fire, two individuals with overdue electric bills, and made the annual donation to the Dillwyn Frie Department that serves the office area. Disbursements totaled \$389.00. Contributions for the quarter totaled \$600. (FBC - \$500 and Mt. Zion - \$100 – outstanding deposits). Available Funds, as of March 31, totaled \$7,289.48 with outstanding checks of \$214. The Benevolence Fund CD Balance is \$5,203.06. The report was approved as presented.

Marilyn, Moderator, commented on the past quarter and events coming up this spring.

- Rev. Skip Wallace, BGAV Field Representative, could not be in attendance for this meeting.
- There have been no changes in pastors since the January meeting.
- Two church Treasurers participated in the Church & Clergy Tax Webinar (Judy Ownby & Kathy Weaver)
- Three pastors participated in the Preaching Conference (Rev. Dave Vogt, Rev. Austin Williams, & Rev. Dane Gressett)
- Our JRBA Hope for Appalachia Team had a very good trip to Kentucky, spreading the love of Jesus and sharing the Gospel with the children. JRBA churches collected 1,127 Hope boxes as well as many other items for the schools as well as some monetary donations.
- Churches continued to generously give to missions through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering.
- JRBA thanks Austin for making a trip to the office and working on the computer.
- Funds are slowly coming in for our Rise Against Hunger Meal Packing event in October. Those funds are due by July 15.
- A couple of churches have already made a donation for the Bland Mission Trip. Please remember that the Bland Ministry Center has recently lost a lot of its funding and it serves many needy people in SW Virginia and beyond. Please encourage your churches to make a donation by May
 The team will also be taking donations of peanut butter and NEW packaged underwear (all sizes). These items are also due by May 6.
- Our Missions Committee has been working hard to make the JRBA Youth Explosion (May 31-June1) an event that will help our Youth know what Jesus did for them and is still doing for them, if they will let Him be Lord of their life. The response from our JRBA churches, other churches, and businesses of the community, has been incredible. Austin has also secured a Kairos Initiative Grant of \$2,000 from BAV for the event. I know the event will be spectacular! There should be funds left over for another Youth event in 2025!
- JRBA WMU Spring Meeting will be at Antioch (Scottsville) on April 14 when Gwynn Tyler will be telling about his recent mission trip to Honduras.
- "It's All About You" Evangelism Workshop at Arvon on May
 Rev. Woody Moore and Rev. Geoff Bruschi will be leading this workshop.
- The JRBA Semi-Annual Meeting will be held at Tar Wallet on May 9, with music by the CVCS Junior Troupe and a personal testimony by Michael Moss.
- The JRBA Bland Mission Trip is May 19 24.
- JRBA-sponsored Baccalaureates for Buckingham and Cumberland are coming up in May as well as recognition of seniors in Fluvanna.
- Vacation Bible Schools are being planned to reach the children with the Gospel during the summer months.

Please keep all of these events in your prayers. It is exciting to see JRBA planning and reaching out to our children, youth, and high school students as they are the future of the church and need to know the Lord!

Mrs. Betty Toney, WMU Director, reiterated the upcoming JRBA WMU Annual Meeting and encouraged everyone to attend. A written BCM report by Rev. Cadance Tyler was included in the meeting packet. She told about several things the Longwood BCM students had participated in during the past quarter and welcomed partnership from churches for next year. Donations are encouraged such as snacks, toiletries, and medical supplies (tissues, Tylenol, cough drops, etc.) Churches are also encouraged to provide a meal for the students or make a monetary donation for their mission projects. Next, Rita Harris, presented the Nominating Committee Report, including the Slate of Officers for 2024-2025. She noted her thanks for those who have agreed to serve.
